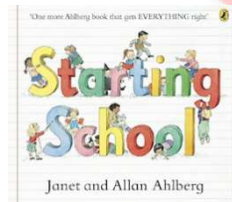
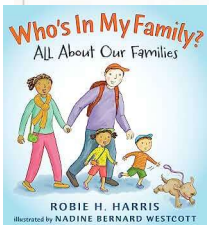
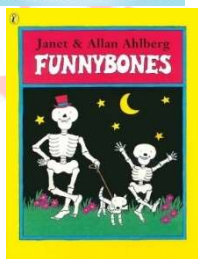
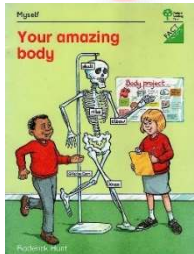
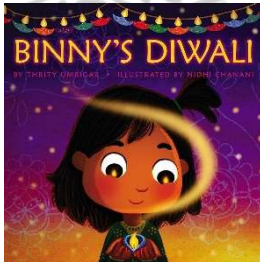
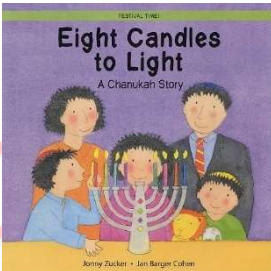
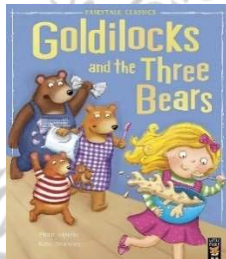
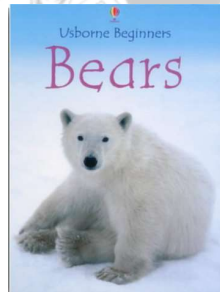
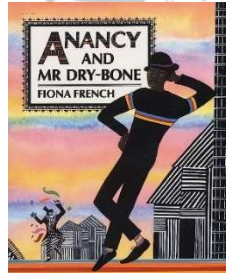
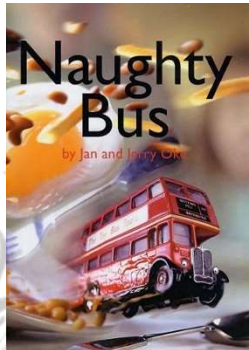
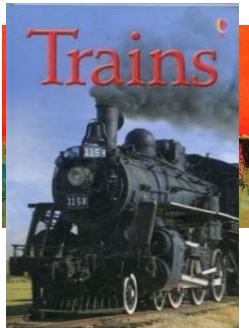
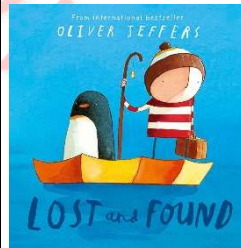
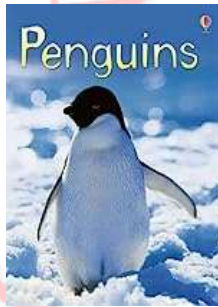
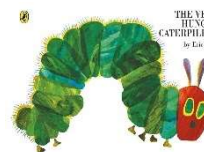
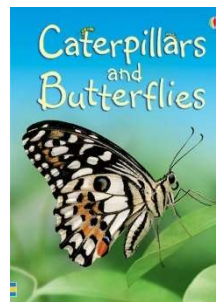
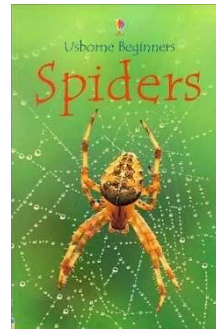
Our Values
